### Tell us about your contribution to the Community as a Volunteer outside of work?

I spend a significant amount of time volunteering in the community. In the past I was a senior first aider with St John Ambulance, with my "claim to fame" being that I was on duty on the day of the riots at the Ireland v England game in 1995.

In 2013 following a local tragedy I set up a suicide awareness group (NINA for Life). I realised that there was a knowledge gap and people needed information and support in area of suicide awareness, mental health and wellbeing. The aim of the group was not to be a counselling service but to work with the professional organisations such as HSE, Pieta House, SOS, Jigsaw and Shannons Hopeline etc. to deliver community training and education. The group is still going strong and I now operate as a support volunteer and advisor.

In 2016 I joined Kingswood Community Centre and was elected Chairperson shortly afterwards. I have spent the last number of years reinventing the centre and striving to deliver new and improved essential Community Services. One of our most successful has been our Community Choir. This was set up as a six-week project for Mental Health Month in October 2019. Despite the impact of Lockdown, the Choir has stayed together and now has 45 members. Our ethos is "That nobody has to audition, everyone can sing and everybody is welcome". On 13th May 2022 we performed to a full house in a concert with Dublin

### Tell us how you spend you chill out time and how you achieve the balance?

In my spare time 😊, and to unwind I am a percussionist with Dublin Ukulele Collective. We perform at many festivals EL (Electric Picnic), Kaleidoscope, Wilde Roots etc.). In June we are headlining The Grand Northern Ukulele Festival, Huddersfield UK. I achieve the balance because my family are not only supportive but are as much part of the journey as I am.

The Dream started when our daughter Laura was eleven, at that time we ran the Kingswood Youth Choir and we invited The Dublin Gospel Choir to do a fundraiser in the Community. At the end of the Concert our daughter said that when she grew up, she would sing with DGC and she would bring them back to do a fundraiser. In 2022 as a family, we sat down and Laura announced "It is time for the fundraiser" That is how I was inspired to organize and achieve the Night of Soul on the 13<sup>th</sup> May 2022 with Kingswood Community Choir and The Dublin Gospel Choir.
